This is in reply to your letter of June 3, 1976, concerning the records of the Warren Commission.

We do not reproduce the films listed in your letter without written permission from the copyright owners. Please obtain this permission for us if you want copies of the films. The copyright owners are listed with the films in Entry 18 of the inventory of the records. We regret that the information furnished in our letter of May 13, 1976, regarding Item 1(b) in Entry 18 of the inventory of the records was erroneous. We do not reproduce the film without permission from Station WDSU-TV (New Orleans). The cost of the film was also incorrect. The minimum order on motion pictures is \$24.00.

~~There is no minimum order on sound recordings. Therefore, it is not necessary for you to purchase all the tapes of a particular radio station at one time. The tapes are all 1-track, 7.5 inches per second, 7" reel, and mostly 1200' per reel. The cost is usually \$9.90 per reel, depending on the exact length of the tape. We can furnish electrostatic copies of the outlines of the contents of the tapes for the following stations at the rate of 15 cents per page, with a minimum order of \$2.00, or a total cost of \$73.95: KBOY (18 p.), KIKL (5 p.), KLIF (130 p.), KSKY (76 p.), KVIL (1 p.), KRLD (173 p.), KXOI (3 p.), WBAP (51 p.), WFAA (7 p.), and WRR (29 p.).~~
