
I am sorry that I must notify you that an additional five day extension of the period for reply to your letter is necessary. A reply will be sent to you by November 19, 1976.



Because of the large volume of the material you have requested, I must notify you that a five day extension of the period for reply to your letter is necessary. A reply will be sent to you by November 12, 1976.


