- Third by far most voluminous, perhaps 4" thick

It does not include request or appeal or refusals of both nor does it include offers of compromise or records of equipment to take pictures, records of the parties taking or of the untrustworthiness of the file, etc. No copy of regulations then in effect or change in them during this litigation. I think it is apparent that this limit on compliance was delayed for the end of depositions in CA 75-226 & for Robinson's decision in CA 75-1448. No search should have been required. All should have been at one point in files. There is nothing from GSA, which was involved. These pages do not even reflect the disposition of the case. The lapse of time is 4, 6 + 2 months
