Dear Mr. Weisberg:

In response to a Freedom of Information request and appeal of Howard Roffman of Jacksonville, Florida, the General Services Administration is transmitting to him today a number of documents related to your efforts to obtain a copy of the so-called "memorandum of transfer." While most of the documents are familiar to you, you have probably never seen several of the documents from the files of the GSA Office of General Counsel, and you have previously been denied access to the enclosed documents taken from the files of the National Archives and Records Service.

Accordingly, we enclose:

- Tab A - materials located among the retired files of the GSA Office of General Counsel;
- Tab B - materials located among the active files of the GSA Office of General Counsel; and
- Tab C - materials from the files of the National Archives previously denied you.

Because we have determined that there is no compelling reason to deny you access to any of these materials, we draw no conclusions about the applicability of any of the Freedom of Information Act's statutory exemptions.

Our counsel has spoken with your counsel, James Lesar, who stated that you had no objection to the transmittal of your correspondence to Mr. Roffman.
