Dear Mr. Weisberg:

This is in response to your letter of August 9, 1974, in which you inquired about the declassification of Warren Commission Document 1131 (4 p.) and the deleted sentence of page 26 of CD 1552(a), referred to in our letter to you of August 5, 1974. Specifically, you that "with regard to those pages referred to in Miss Smith's letter. I would like to know who classified originally and the basis, the same for the declassification and why the declassification seems to be out of the regular order."

Since all classification actions relating to the above mentioned documents were taken by the agency of origin, the Central Intelligence Agency, we suggest you write directly to that Agency for the information you are interested in obtaining.

In regard to your comments concerning fees for reproductions, our schedule of fees was revised on April 22, 1974, after a careful study by our staff. You may be interested to know, however, that we still furnish electrostatic copies to searchers in our research rooms for 10 cents per page and in this instance there is no minimum charge.
