This is in reply to your letters of October 9, 13, and 30, 1975. We are sorry to learn that you have been ill and regret the delay in answering your letters caused by the increased work on the records of the Commission.

As you are probably aware, a response to your suit has been filed.

We can furnish you copies of about 20 documents (120 p.) relating to the activities of Mark Lane for \$18.00. The documents consist chiefly of FBI reports concerning Mr. Lane's speeches and copies of his articles. Copies of these records have not previously been sent to you because we were not sure you would want them. If there are any other documents of which you have heard that are of interest to you, we will be pleased to receive your request for copies of them.

I am sorry that the information given you about the status of your account was furnished without checking with our Cashier about the matter. There was actually an amount due of \$52.90 as of September 16, 1975. Since March 28, 1975, there have been charges to the account of \$207.80. Your check sent with your letter of October 30 left you a credit balance of \$47.10.

We have consulted the CIA about your requests and have referred a copy of your letter of October 30 to the CIA with a letter from us, of which a copy is enclosed.

No agency has transferred any records relating to the Warren Commission to NARS.
