The largest single source seems to be CIA, several docs on "Secret Agent D", some on conflicts with State info, info from the USSR and about LMO,

I don't know when I can get to the Archives, or how many, if any, of these docs I can afford?



Dear Mr. Johnson.

I am sorry that neither your nor Ries Smith were evailable when I phoned yesterday. Although my recent requests for it had not been filled, the list of the 1972-3 declaration had been sout me by Ries. Smith under date of July 18,1973. It had been mislaid.

I also phoned to see if my demposit was sufficient to cover the costs of copying all of it.

Hr. Leaky said you were copying this for me, that my deposit was smething like \$5.00 short and that you would prefer to have this prior to nailing.

So that this need not trouble you as seen again and that there been no delay in any future nailings I enclose a check for \$100. In this way you will have no problem copying whatever is declassified for me as seen as it is declassified. As I asked you, I'd like everything as it is declassified without notification as seen as it becomes available unless the length and coots are extraordinary.

I do believe that seme pages that had been withheld from documents I had received were made available and were not sent to me. This is not because my deposit did not cover their cost.

The list, while helpful, cannot be definitive. It appears that a few of the entries had been declassified, I think some for me. I do not think you should have to wender of take time to discover if I have been provided ceptes of these relatively for pages. Unless there is a duplication of considerable length, just make a copy for me without taking the time to check.

I do want each document released in this declaration.

On any you have not yet depied and where it is possible in the future, where the original document is on letter-eised paper I would prefer that the copy also be an letter-eised paper. My files are letter-eised.

If you are to draft Dr. Rhonds' responses to some of my recent inquiries these in which I have most immediate interest relate to documents dealing with the spectrographic and neutron activation analyses. You are some that this matter is currently before the courts. Hy verbal request to you was an May 13. I do need all of these documents. Those that were sent me were not all.
