I went through the very first there are breakdowns within each letter of the alpenbet), the Bo on (nothing shoiwing and letter to Abe Bolden in response to his), end the W file, from which I asked for several copies. Here the letters to the Dallas Radio-TV statuons thanks them for the materials they made ave lable, indicating the Commission did get their tapes.

The third box I am confident I went over in early 1968. It is from this box that copies I ordered were not made, to which Simmons a parently referred (se letter 1068)

Box 4 is "Commission Staff, Memoranda For the Record, List Circulars."

It includes members and staff. The staff circulars are broken down 12/63 to 5/64 and 6/64 on.

Some I would have gotten (and did not take time to read) would have been just too costly in terms of what I felt could be exjected, yet here is the possibility of consider able reward, especially in terms of staff knowledge not reflected in the Report or deliberately withheld from it. Example, 76-page on by Ely on Oswald's life from birth to his discharge from the Marine Corps. There is another, not as long, on Cawald's biography.

Redlich 3/8, also 0 Post Russien, on how did the police know to go to 1026 as soon as they did (I have others on this, and the question is never answered, all possibilities proving there is no explanation (I intend this for Agent Oswald).

There is a long Ely max memo on his phone conversations with Oswald's fellow marines. It is based on these, apparently, that he prepared affidavits for t eir signatures, a wierd way of investigating.

Murray, Jr. (A), Paul Edward Murphy A), Mack Osborne (A), Rosaleen Quinn (listed as Gulen), Henry J. Rouseel (A). This file elso indicates that Osborne was in Grand Parisie, Texas, explanation enought for the tip on Thomsley reaching Murcoch, about which I have other files. I am getting some.
