Did FBI have autopsy? First page of Gemberlings 100-10461 Field, 105-8255 dated 12/10/63, folio 1 of his summary, lists "Autopsy performed on body of President KENNEDY". (See below)

The bag: "No positive identification obtained concerning wrapping paper in shape of a large bag found at scene of assassination as being identical ~~xxx~~ to that being carried by OSWALD ~~to~~ work on morning of 11/22/63". Sibert, O'Neill interview with Kellerman 11/27/63 folios 347, inconsistent with Kellerman's testimony but includes what Kellerman did not say that is consistent with evolving story: "He stated he distinctly heard three shots". Report includes Greer.

Seat not elevated 10/22

At hosp. Connally responded to Kellerman. Conscious.

"Kellerman advised he did not notice the extent of the injury to the President although he noticed a wound in the back of the head."

Three people apparently from hospital assisted in moving bodies. Both K and G left with Pres. Presumably at this moment car unguarded. No specific ref. Additional pictures: LIFE has, made by John Martin, supt. safety, Rm 517, Houston St. Annex P.O., RI 8-3181. Movie "made while MARTIN was standing on Houston Street, adjacent to the Dallas County Sheriff's Office Building. Martin said there is a possibility he obtained movies of the Texas School Book Depository Building... Mrs. PAT SWANK, Life Magazine representative in Dallas, telephone LA6-1398. The film was eventually placed in the hands of a Mr. BILLINGSLEY, representative of Life Magazine, Room 1106 Adolphus Hotel..."

Agt. Charles T. Brown This happened 12/3. Report undated, unsigned, DL 89-43 Mrs. Alvin Hopson, on 4th Floor, TSDB, 12/4/63, fols. 21-24 had car hidden from her view (she was looking) time ass. She "thought they (shots) had been set off on the street (firecrackers) below... did not sound to her like the shots were coming from her building". Agent Odum

Agent Pinkston, DL 89-43, undated Mrs. Charles T. Davis, 4th floor employee. After she returned to office from front bldg she was told by fellow employee Mary Hollis, who was watching from window 4th fl. "Immediately after the shots were fired she thought she heard footsteps running across the floor directly above her..." She could hear, but those with hearing acute enough to hear click of rifle, falling of shell, could not hear O's movements? Fol. 23 *And who saw her* 12/5/63 rept Hall, White interview 1/4 with Mrs. Eric (Carolyn) Walther: She saw, about a little after 12:20, "a man wearing a brown suit and a very dark red shirt leaning out of a window of the third floor.. "before epileptic seizure.

After *umb*, left she says she saw "a man standing on either the fourth or fifth floor in the southeast corner window... most easterly.. had the window open and was standing with both his hands extended outside the window ledge. In his hands this man was holding a rifle with the barrel pointed downward... white shirt... blond or light hair... *g*uards everywhere..." Another man with him. "apparently wearing a brown suit coat, and the only thing she could see was the right side of the man, from ~~xxxxxxxx~~ about the waist to the shoulders...? Fols 24-5 Mrs. Pearl Springer, with Mrs. Walther, did not notice this. Fol 26.

Mary Muchmore interviewed 12/4/63 Robert E. Bashman, but few deprecating lines. Wilma Bond, with her with box camera "did not obtain any photographs of the assassination scene" in the FBI paraphrase of M, not Bonds, "She said that WILMA BOND had some of her photographs developed but they were just of the crowd and the caravan from where they were standing..." No FBI interest! Fol 31 Folio 32 WBAP made its footage available to FBI 11/23 It "did contain several frames of the building which are of no particular ~~interest~~ significance at this time. Although the film shows "people running from the building or people possibly seen in the building... lying on the ground because of the shooting" the FBI says "this film was first run without being edited and, of course, the sequence might indicate to viewers that the building scene was taken at the time of the assassination, which is not true." When the hell else could such picture be taken? It seems that here the FBI (no direct quote from Byron, WBAP, means actual shots hitting and is thus deceiving by its language

Marina 11/30 Boguslav, Heitman 40-5 Background in USSR  
12-3 ditto. Fols 46-7 Background, nonsense and she first  
wrote USSR Emb re return 2/63

12/1 ditto, fols 48-52 As Marina was later to say, ~~thing~~  
these guys were interested in the USSR, not the assassination. These are the  
kinds of questions they asked her. She is said to have said that Oswald  
in response to her inquiry said he could not return to US and that "he had  
been offered Soviet citizenship prior to their marriage, but he had refused it."  
12/2 Ditto, fols 53-8 ~~xxxxxx~~ of similar nature.  
12/5/63 fols 59-63, still ~~xxxx~~ nothing on assassination.

A little on Cuba 12/5/63, again of similar nature, except this: when asked  
about long-distance calls, she could recall just one while she was with Ruth  
Paine. It was from Ft. Worth, from a man who had been told "a real Russian  
lived with Mrs. Paine...spent 20 months in Russia during the war and learned  
to speak some Russian and would like to become acquainted with MARINNA...  
identified himself as some kind of colonel." He was supposed to come to  
Paine house Tues. before assassination  
12/1/63 fols 64-9. Here she indicates the real ~~xxx~~ O used ~~in~~  
the name OH Lee at the rooming house was to hide his past and keep his job,  
"He didn't want people asking questions." Also, the Saturday he had satyed in  
Dallas he had done so to apply for a photorgaphic job he didn't get and he  
went to the Paine's that afternoon....Story of O sleeping through alarm, she  
awakened him, no breakfast, etc. ~~Ordered 68a~~ - she spent first night with Curry.

Part V, "Crime scene and related searches and results ofn he FBI laboratory and  
other related examinations"- three parts, A, autopsy; b bag; c, shirt  
Fols 301-18- shirt-  
12/4-Bledsoe; 12/5. Frazier; 12/5, Truly; 12/5, Givens (similar but "would not  
state definitely"; Jarman, 12/5; Randle. 12/5; Mrs. Reid, 12/5; Bonnie Williams,  
12/5; 11/30, FBI Agent Gary S. Wilson, apparently his own statement, "I distinctly  
remember that he was wearing either a white or extremely light colored shirt  
and dark trousers. This observtion was made outside the theater ~~xxxxxx~~  
while officers escorted him from the theater entrance to a waiting police car.  
...my only definite recollection is of the color of his clothing..." If this  
is how totally wrong a presumed trained observer can be, what can be expected  
of ordinary mortals? etc. Bob K Carroll (12/4, fol 315) still said he arrested O.  
There is no identification of the shirt in 12/4, DeBrueys q and statement of  
Detective Fay M. Turner, who says he "identified this shirt as being the shirt  
he personally seized by a search warrant from LEE HARVEY OSWALD's room...in  
the presence of Detective WALTER E POTTS and District Attorney BILL ALEXANDER  
But according to the table of contents, but one shirt, the O was wearing, is  
the subject of these state ments

Part D of V is omitted from the table of contents. it is on FBI Lab Exams

Part A, autopsy, consists of nothing but the few FBI reports, fols 281-9/  
This is highly unlikely and highly suspect.

Oddly, two pages of the lab examinations, 328 and 9, are withheld by the FBI  
Folio 352, re "The K42 gray jacket" has dry-cleaners tag B 9738 stapled in  
it and 30 030 marked in the collar. Page 361 also withheld by FBI

Part E is on fingerprints Apparently the paper of the Enco map, which he is  
not known to have used or handled in some time, held his prints while that of  
the bag and miscellaneous boxes did not. (FF 363)

Part F is Miscellaneous (Fols 377-

Part VI is "Other Investigation Relating to Lee Harvey Oswald" 393-

Some of it may relate to the False Oswald. 413 withheld by FBI. Ditto 416, 7.  
11/28 report quotes (but deprecates that John D Kilgore, Shreveport, LA.  
said he recognized a newspaper picture of O as that of a man he had seen  
while working for the V.C. Bilbo trucking co, about 10 months 1963, without any  
indicting agents asked which. This man supposedly worked for four months.  
Once three men are supposed to have come and left with O and Bilbo. A check of  
payroll records under the name of O is indicated (fol. 422) but not under  
any of the names of those in the False Oswald case.

VIII Misc- allegations regarding others identified and unidentified. There  
then appears a green sheet saying the FBI has requested the withholding of folios  
494-777. This is every paper in section eight! 281 pages! From the index this  
includes the right-wing stuff, i.e. CUSA, p. 715 with companies known to have  
given employment to some of the "members"; three Campbells, Dr. Donald and W  
William R, Jr. and Sr.; Cornell, Lynn, 749; Cotton, B.T. 670; Cornia, Caludia,  
511; Crawford, William, 687; Crawley, Joe Doyle (and grocery) 522, 524; Csala,  
Joseph, 530; Cunningham, Mrs. Helen, 527; Mrs. Jesse Curry, 767; Sister  
Mary Cyrilla, 756, 757; Danner, Howard and Joseph Howard, 531, 532; Darby,  
Miss Judy, 758; Davis, Jean and Norma Jean, 722; de Dusseldorf, Enrico Aaron,  
646, 648, 653; Delgallo, Robert, 632;  
Dezern, H.W. 635; DiMaria, Frank, 693, 696; Dreadfulwater, Charles, C.L., Jay  
Berry Mrs. J.B. Joseph Driscoll; Mrs. Drumgoole (Bally O.) Dukavits, Dr.

2 references to LIFELINE; Rev Joseph Nagy; "Operation Abolition"; Slezak,  
Father; American Fact Finding Committee; American Jewish Committee (guess how  
referred to? 444993 relate to Ruby, from table contents (slip missing in  
proper place in text) and Ruby-Oswald connections and should be withheld.

But 100 on allegations regarding other persons is withheld, and in all these  
pages not a single reference to any of the people in the "False Oswald" story.
