McChann knows Mrs. Eugene Link, Albert Tamay, Marcella Insua and Hector Isguerivo. Has been interviewed and co-operated with F.B.I. S.A., Heitman Re: unnamed political Cuban who worked at Parkland Hosp. Quotes Sylvia Odio's story, that she was interviewed Re: L.H.O. incident in early December by F.B.I. States Odio related that she'd been regularly approached for help by various Cuban groups. McChann gives opinion Re: Odios truthfulness, pointing to her mental condition. At agents request McChann phones Odio for info. on 4-30-64 and related: Odio in Re: to visit says one stated he was using code name Leopoldo, second man Eugenio Cisneros and third Leon. In Re: to F.B.I. interview; that these questions were not asked. She has an uncle in N.O. Dr. Augustine Guitart at Xavier Univ. She stated John Martin is a Uruguayan who is supplying S. Amer. arms to Cuban groups.
