Dear Mr. Johnson,

ATtached to the undated memo WARREN COMMISSION RECORDS just received is a 10-page listing of documents. Thank you for these.

4/7/77

As you know I have a standing request for all released JFX assassination records. As I know it may well be impossible for you to check to determine whether or not I have already obtained some of these records. I knew I do not have the photographs. Most of these records are of a few pages. Some of the longer ones duplicate records I have already obtained, differing in new having the material previously withheld. As I recall it my protests over these unjustified withheldings were ignored, as were my appeals. While under these circumstances I do not believe I should be charged for the copies I do not make an issue of it. With one exception I am ordering copies of all listed materials. The one exception is Item 1 under <u>Hiscellaneous Records</u>.I think I have it. Getting a duplicate will cost about \$25.00. I would therefore like a copy of any page that will permit identification, like the table of contents. If I then

If the cost exceeds what <sup>I</sup> have on deposit I will, as you know, remit promptly. If you cannot supply these records promptly if you will let me know the cost I will send a check covering it so I may maintain the deposit at a suitable level.

There are records relating to the withholding and the release of these records. I would like all of them. Where there has been withholding by obliteration there are copies showing what was to be obliterated. I would like a set of copies of all those relating to the records now released from which there was such obliteration. As you are aware we are in current litigation in which this is relevant. I not only want to examine the legitimacy of these withholdings by obliteration for myself. I want to have an accordited expert make an independent examination and provide an affidavit for filing with the court. I therefore ask for these copies as soon as possible.

As you are aware in his recent deposition Lyndal Shaneyfelt testified to taking closeup pictures of the curbetene and supplying them to the Commission. If there are any such photographs other than those printed in Volume 21 I would like copies as seen as possible. Of the other Shaneyfelt photographic exhibits in this volume I would also appreciate Sx10 glassys of Nos. 24, 14 and that part of 23 on page 466. I do anticipate in-court uses.

To save you letter writing I enclosed a \$100 addition to my account.

Because there is a coincidence between the release of what had been denied to me and the well-financed and officially-assisted book project of one whose writing is congenial to officialdom I ask to be informed if any of these releases are directly or indirectly at the requests of others. This relates particularly but not exclusively to the Nomenke records.
