"Memorandum of transfer" of Materials Relating to the Autopsy of President Kennedy.

To: L (Nr. Robert J. Yock)

The Secret Service has sent us electrostatic copies of certain documents relating to the autopsy of President Kennedy, probably as a result of letters addressed to the Secret Service by Mr. Harold Weisberg, who has been requesting copies of these documents. Enclosed are copies of the Secret Service transmittal letter and attachments. The last two pages of the attachments consist of a list of the documents, X-rays, photographs, and other material transferred by Dr. Burkley on April 26, 1965, to Mrs. Evelyn Lincoln as a representative of the Kennedy family. This Document is the Government copy of the "memorandum of transfer" of the autopsy material which is referred to in the report of the panel of doctors who examined the autopsy X-rays and photographs in 1968.

At the time of Mr. Weisberg's request for a copy of this "memorandum of transfer" Last year, Mr. Van Cleve consulted Mr. Burke Marshell, the legal representative of the Kennedy family. As a result we withheld the "memorandum of transfer" from research on the ground that the copy of the memorandum referred to in the report of the panel of doctors was the property of the Kennedy family. Enclosed are copies of Mr. Van Cleve's memorandum and the letter we sent to Mr. Weisberg.

I wish to inquire whether there is any legal basis for withholding the Government copy of the "memorandum of transfer" from research, as distinguished from the copy which is the property of the Kennedy family. The memorandum lists some materials which were not transferred back to the Government by the Kennedy family. Mr. Weisberg and others will promptly raise questions concerning this material if the memorandum is made public.

The remainder of the documents sent us by the Secret Service can be made available for research. Enclosed is a proposed draft of a letter to Mr. Weisberg to be used if the "memorandum of transfer" is made available for research.
