This is in response to your letter of June 20, 1970 addressed to the Director of Information in regard to your appeal from the alleged denial of the National Archives and Records Service to furnish you access to certain archival materials in connection with the assassination of President Kennedy.

Your letter specifically requests four items: (1) a copy of the photograph taken by the Archives staff showing the front of the President's shirt; (2) a photograph of the knot of the President's tie; (3) photograph of the back of the President's shirt with the top of the collar included, showing the area of damage; and (4) to examine the photographs taken with CBS equipment by the Archives staff. After consultation with the NARS staff it has been determined that items 2, 3 and 4 above are new requests never denied to you by NARS; that item 1 has been denied to you only in terms of having a copy made for your own benefit. NARS has specifically indicated they will allow you to examine the photographs indicated in item 1 in the Archives Building. In addition, NARS has properie and allowing one to examine the politographs indicated a willingness to supply you with photographic copies of items in the Inchica Building to supply you the photograph in ident, 2 and 3, and to allow you to examine item Ephotographs in the Archives and to furnish you prime of the item 5 geholographs.
