Dear Mr. Weisberg:

This is in response to your letter of June 20, 1970 addressed to the Director of Information in regard to your appeal from the alleged denial of the National Archives and Records Service to furnish you access to certain archival materials in connection with the assassination of President Kennedy.

Your letter specifically requests four items: (1) a copy of the photograph taken by the Archives staff showing the front of the President's shirt; (2) a photograph of the knot of the President's tie; (3) photograph of the back of the President's shirt with the top of the collar included, showing the area of damage; and (4) to examine the photographs taken with CBS equipment by the Archives staff. After consultation with the NARS staff it has been determined that items 2, 3 and 4 above <sup>have</sup> ~~are new requests never~~ <sup>been</sup> ~~denied~~ to you by NARS; that item 1 has been denied to you only in terms of having a copy made for your own benefit. NARS has specifically indicated they will allow you to examine the photographs indicated in item 1 in the Archives Building. In addition, NARS has indicated a willingness to <sup>prepare and allow you to examine the photographs in its</sup> ~~supply you with photographic copies of items~~ 2 and 3, <sup>in the Archives Building, to supply you the photograph in item 4,</sup> and to allow you to examine item 4 <sup>and to furnish you prints of the item 5 photographs.</sup> photographs in the Archives Building. Consequently, an appeal at this point under the GSA regulations

(41 CFR 105-60.404) is <sup>unnecessary</sup> ~~premature~~ and inappropriate. The item 5 photographs <sup>do not include any photographs of President Kennedy's clothing.</sup>

*(from the negative of the shirt <sup>prepared</sup> taken by the Archives; (4) an enlarged photograph of the back of the shirt prepared from the negative for Commission Exhibit 394, not including the collar area;*

You have also requested in your letter that all denials by NARS for access to records be automatically treated as appealed. GSA regulations do not provide for such automatic appeal and we consequently cannot accommodate your request. The appeal channel, however, will be available to you upon request as to any denial that you feel is unjustified.
