Appeal under the Freedom of Information Act

Assistant Administrator for Administration - B

Pursuant to an administrative appeal of Mr. Harold Weisberg dated January 5, 1973, for access to copies of previously denied records under the Freedom of Information Act (attachment A), Mr. Marion Johnson of the National Archives and Mr. Steven Garfinkel of this office met with the Freedom of Information Committee of the Department of Justice on February 16. The participants at that meeting agreed that Mr. Weisberg's appeal be decided in the following manner:

- 1) that the so-called "memorandum of transfer" of the material relating to the autopsy of President Kennedy be withheld pursuant to subsection (b)(6) of title 5, United States Code, "personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosume of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy ";
- 2) that the letter of November 13, 1970, from Assistant Director of the Secret Service Thomas J. Relley to the Archivist, be withheld pursuant to subsection (b)(5) of title 5, United States Code, "inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency . . . " (attachment B);
- 3) that copies of the letters from Mr. Kelley to the Archivist dated March 6, 1970, and December 14, 1970, and General Counsel Mankin's letter to Mr. Kelley dated December 10, 1970, be released to the requester.

If you agree, we have prepared a letter to Mr. Weisberg for your signature reflecting this decision.
