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DNIGVEN In response to your letter of April 3, 1904, as it pertains to Nancy Elaine Perrin, I am enclosing herewith a letterhead menorandum dated April 8, 1964, at San Francisco, 9 California, entitled "Nancy Elaino Perrin" which Lots forth the information you requested. Also encloded is a letterhead menorandem Cated April 13, 1964, at Vashington, D. C., which sets forth the contact of our Doston Office with Perrin on January 21 and 23, 1964. This latter information was not previously turnished as it is merely a reiteration of her original story which was furnished to you along with results of our investigation to check her story by report of Special Agent Lanning C. Clements, Dallas, Texas, dated December 13, 1963.

Ers. Perrin'was afforded a polygraph examination on December 5, 1963, but the results of the examination were inconclusive due to her past medical history, emotional instability, and the use of drugs by Hrs. Perrin prior to the examination. Although the results were inconclusive, details of the examination are also being furnished to you along with the information relating to the subsequent contact of our Doston Office with Perrin as this information may be of additional assistance to you in evaluating the testimony 162-1090 of Permin.

MANCY ELAINE PERRIN

Ling. Mancy Perrin, Executives Unlimited, 100 Ecylston Street, Suite 200, Ecston, Massachusetts, on January 21, 1964, tolephonically contacted the Ecston Office of the FBL. She stated that about two months ago she was in Oakland, California, and went to the FDL Office there because she had worked for Jack Ruby. Ene said she was given a polygraph test by the FDL, and as far as she knows this test was inconclusive. She stated that she had never proviously taken a polygraph test and that she suffers from an ailment known as chorea which she states is commonly known as St. Vitus's dance. She also stated that on occasion she takes a drug to control or stabilize her blood pressure.

Lrs. Perrin said that she previously informed the FBI at Oakland, California, she had attended some neetings with Jack Ruby, and it was not until the second neeting that she learned that Ruby was nimed up in running guns into Cuba and taking refugees out of Cuba. Hrs. Perrin stated that she desired to be contacted by the FDI at her office because she had gone through some of her things and found additional information which would bear out statements she did not previously have in her possession. The requested that she be telephonically contacted before an Agent comes to her office and that she did not wish to be contacted at her residence, 196 Newbury Avenue, North Quincy, Hassachusetts, where she is now living with a very elderly voman.

Cn January 23, 1964, Lrs. Nancy Perrin vas interviewed at her place of employment, Executives Unlimited, by Special Agents Janes J. Stratford, Jr., and John F. Eweency. Eno metvised she had worked as a bartender for a few months in 1961 for Jack Ruby and she has been employed

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for the past two weeks as an executive for Executives Unlimited which is an employment agency. The was been on September 9, 1936, at Portsmouth, Now Hampshire. Her husband, Robert, died August, 1962, at New Crleans, Louisiana. She recalled that she and her husband, Robert, attended some meetings at Dallas, Texas, which she believed concorned getting refugees out of Cuba. The purpose in her attending these meetings was her belief that she and her husband could nake some money by bringing refugees cut of Cuba. Then she heard that these meetings had the twofold purpose of also bringing guns into Cuba, She and her husband were not interested.

Ers. Porrin was extremely vague as to how these. neotings came about, but she recalled that Edward Erunner of Grand Prairie, a suburb of Dallas, Texas, the was an associate of her husband, first brought up the subject nattor of these meetings. Then she went to the meeting, she was surprised to see Jack Euby there because she had vorked for him in the past and he had physically assaulted her. They were bitter enemies. She learned that this group was going to run guns from Mexico to Cuba for Fidel Castro. After the third meeting, she and her husband valked out and had nothing further to do with this organization. At one of these meetings, she alleged that Tuby had a bulge in his pecket which she thought was money he passed to sense unidentified colonel who was in charge of this organization. Enercealled that an individual by the name of Dave C. (last name unknown), who was employed at the University Club, Dallas, Texas, as a bartender, seemed to be one of the heads of this organization.

Lins. Porrin stated that she had no information regarding Lee Harvey Oswald but she believed that Ruby was told to kill Cawald. She had no information to support her belief in this regard. She stated she now recalls what the contact was in connection with the gun running. According to her, the contact was to be made at the Hotel Nuevo Gallina, Guadalajara, Monico. She said she did not have this information available when she was interviewed in California.

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Ers. Forrin adviced it seemed logical to her that Oswald belonged to some organization, and it sound logical to her that someone from Chicago was behind the deal with regard to the guns. She had no information to support her belief in this regard. She then said in a very vague cort of way that huby had been contacted by Vite Genevese. She then stated it was not Vite Conevese but one of his sons who dropped in to see Jack Ruby at the Carousel Club, Ballas, Temas. She places the time of her employment for Ruby between June and September, 1961.

Ins. Porrin said the was errested by the Brockline, L'assechusetts, Police Department for prostitution and was convicted in court and paid a fine of \$200.00. For case is coming up for a parden, and the has prominent politicians to obtain a parden for her. At the time she was prostituting, she was engaged in this activity because her husband was sick and she needed the mency.

With regard to Jack Ruby, whom she described as a very pugnacious individual, she also stated she had never heard him empress any opinions or any vicus with regard to politics or with regard to President Konnedy.
