I enclose the transcript of the Liebeler tapes as promised, and also return the two pieces from your forthcoming book.

As you'll see, there's a big problem on the transchipt. The Transcription Service assures me they typed up everything on the tapes, and checked out both sides of tem.

But in the transcript there is no mention of the most important partLiebeler changing the Commission report.

Has it been missed out in error... perhaps lost in the copying process?

I'd be grateful if you could check it out. (I hope to be speakin to you on the telephone before you receive this letter...tried today but there was no reply).

Regarding the offer of a look at the rest of the forthcoming book...it's been decided by the executives that they would certainly like to look at the manuscript, but without any guaranteed fee. I've intimated you're feeling that this would not be satisfactory.

But the argument is that we will pay a large fee if any part of the manuscript is accepted.

Anyway, Harold, I leave it up to you. From what you told me, the new evidence you have obtained seems very possible material for us. But I can well understand your reluctance to provide a look-see without a fee.

A point that we ARE very interested in at this end - an interview with James Thomas Tague, injured by sidewalk fragments during the Kennedy shooting. I'd be grateful if you can provide me with any information on this guy's whereabouts (for which we will pay!)
