'Vindicator' Resurrected

In the masthead snuggling close to Rey nolds's signature and picture is this state ment:

"Opinions in signed articles and letter appearing in the National Record are the opinions of the authors, and not necessarily of the National Record."

Only one author of one article in one issue is mentioned by name among the three issues PM examined.

It might be that Reynolds is bashful. He ran a Daily News editorial of March 31, A Russia Firster, but forgot to say whose story it was.
