JACKSON, Miss. (AP)—Joe Qan Hawkins of Jackson, charged what the attempted bombing of the home of Meridian Jewish leader Meyer Davidson, was released from jall Wednesday shortly after his bond was reduced to \$20,-000.

Hawkins, who said he had been in jail under \$250,000 bond for most of seven months, appeared before circuit Judge Russel Moore in a habeas corpus hearing. He said he was unemployed and estimated his assets at less than \$4,000.
