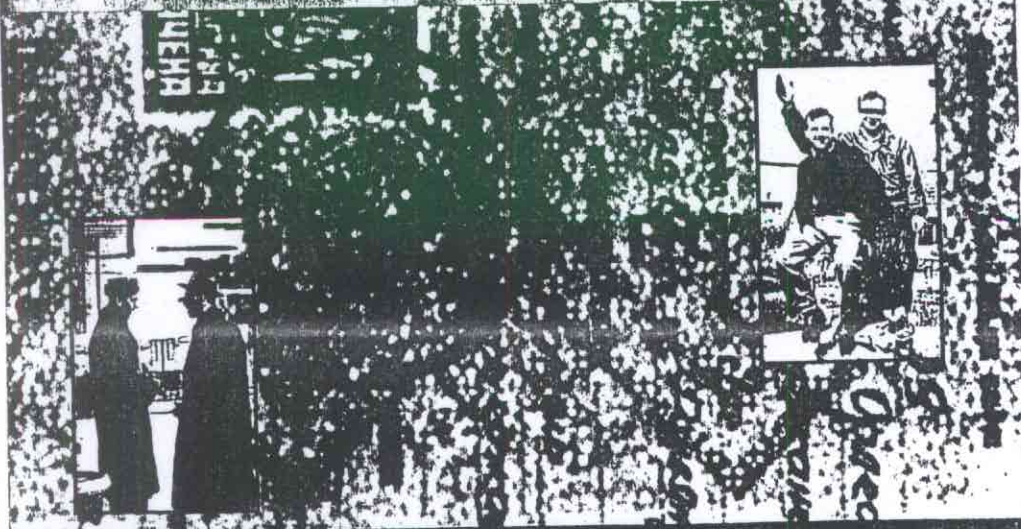

Oleg Maximovich Nechiporenko was a Colonel of Global Foreign Intelligence for the KGB (Soviet Committee for State Security). Considered one of the KGB's most intrepid "Special Operations" officers. In 1961, Col. Nechiporenko was posted to the KGB Station in Mexico City under diplomatic cover of the Soviet Embassy. Following his secret meetings with Oswald, Nechiporenko remained in Mexico until 1965, returning again in 1967. He taught at the Soviet Intelligence officer's college and retired in 1991.
