On 12/2/63, Mrs. DELORES NEELEY, secretary, Bloomfield Enterprises, connected with New Orleans Export-Import Exchange, Room 101, International Trade Mart, 124 Camp Street, advised SA JAMES ROYCE PECK that she could identify one of the persons represented in photographs taken on October 16, 1963 by television station WDSU on the occasion of LEE HARVEY OSWALD's passing of hand bills at the International Trade Mart as a friend of hers by the name of JAMES LAWRENCE employed with the Cross Country Development Co., 3355 Poplar Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee. Mrs. NEELEY added that LAWRENCE would be visiting her office in two weeks time and if necessary he could be contacted there at that time.

She also named WILLIAM CUSPERT BRADY residing somewhere on Dauphine Street as an individual who quite possibly further identify persons represented in these photographs as she said BRADY, a Cuban, was a one time director of the Pan American Center and one time teacher at the New Orleans Academy, both located at New Orleans, Louisiana.
