
Specifically, I wonder if you could tell me the following:

- 1) I have reason to believe that the Times investigation began in early November, 1966. Can you confirm this, or if I am incorrect, can you give me some approximate correct date?
- 2) When was the investigation discontinued?
- 3) When you say that "our inquiries did not turn up anything substantially new in connection with the official findings, we discontinued them," do you mean that your inquiry substantially reaffirmed the findings of the Warren Commission?

I would deeply appreciate any information you can supply me on these questions. If you do not have it available to you, I would be grateful if you could forward this letter on to someone who does.
