On August 26 I sent you a letter requesting information relating to the 1966 <u>New York Times</u> investigation into the slaying of President Kennedy. Nearly a month has passed, and I have received no reply to my letter, a copy of which is enclosed.

I have completed most of my basic research, and I am anxious to begin writing. One might be tempted to draw some rather provocative conclusions when a letter like the one I sent you goes unanswered. I consider myself a responsible writer, however, and I do not wish to draw hasty conclusions.

Since you were a member of the investigation team you should have no problem addressing the questions I ask. As National Editor of the <u>Times</u> it seems to me that you have an additional responsibility to answer my questions since to ignore them must also reflect upon the credibility and integrity of the <u>Times</u> itself.

I trust that I shall receive the courtesy of a prompt reply.
