Jack Rosenthal to Head The Times's Magazine

Jack Rosenthal, the assistant Sunday editor of The New York Times, was appointed yesterday as editor of The New York Times Magazine.

Mr. Rosenthal, whose appointment is effective Jan. 1, will succeed Lewis Bergman, who will become associate editor for special projects until his retirement June 30. Mr. Bergman, 57 years old, has worked in the Sunday department for more than 35 years. For the last 11 years he has been in charge of the magazine.

The change was announced by Max Frankel, the Sunday editor, who said Mr. Rosenthal would continue to serve as his deputy in the supervision of several other sections of the Sunday Times.

Mr. Rosenthal, who is 40 years old, held various newspaper, magazine and Federal Government positions before joining the Washington bureau of The Times.
