Dear Mr. Graham,

Thank you for your note of the 22nd. and the return of "The Dubious Kennedy Inquest". This manuscript is now not under consideration elsewhere in the US but it is abroad. The man I knew at the Saturday Evening Post is no longer there and his former secretary returned it to me promptly. The Post may be considering WHITEWASH or Part 2 of it, I do not know.

I have pretty much decided upon a sequel, tentatively called "Three Shells", a multiple pun, going ahead from WHITEWASH. "Dubious Inquest" will be part of it. I have another piece already drafted, dealing similarly with other aspects of the evidence, and have begun the drafting of a third.

When I am finished, what I hope to have is a series of magazine articles that will make a book, the magazine treatment to be shortened and the book to be illustrated with documents and pictures.

While our finances are at the lowest ebb ever and car problems increase daily, I have rejected one offer for paperback from one of the larger houses and have received a tentative one from another. I expect this to come to nothing until the climate has undergone a further change. The first offer was in many ways not acceptable.

There is considerable radio interest and some from TV. If the Times has any reflection of my bash with Kevin O'Dougherty and Victor Lasky on the Long John Nebel show Saturday morning, I'd appreciate a copy. Also, if you can locate the quote from Rankin for which I asked you, I'd appreciate that, too.

So, if the Times Magazine would like to see "Dubious Inquest" or any other work I have ready at that time, I'll be more than happy to send it to whoever you suggest.
