Dear Mr. Fremont-Smith,

Your listing of the reprint of WHITEMACH in Books Received yesterday is entirely inconsistent with your refusal to list receipt of the original edition (after the New York Times had gotten 15 free copies and had begun to pay for the additional reference copies it ordered) and fortifies my initial conviction that you beyoutted the book simply because it had no consercial imprint.

My belief that your attitude toward my work, your refusal to review or mention it while attributing to others what it had done, has nothing to do with the merit the book has or does not have, seems thus to be justified.

If you know the dismay with which I look back on the total abdication of the intellectual community beginning with the assessination, how utterly uscless (raclly, worse) it was when our society so needed it, you could perhaps understand that it is not alone the damage you have done me that hurts. One might have expected of a man whose livelihood comes from books that he have a desper interest in freedom of publication.

What little information I have on the sale of the Dell edition indicates considerable success. Lost wask it was reported to have been the second best selling of all paperbacks and the best-selling work of non-fiction in Philadelphia. This, to the best of my knowledge, without any advertising.

Now I ask you to try and understand what I earlier suggested you write about, the effect of critics and their godly decisions and opinions.
