Dear M and F,

The man says he cannot disprove it.

Also, I have not received the pictures of your study of the rifle pictures (or my rifle). That should come directly to me, with the copy for below for me to deliver. There is more chaos there than you can imagine and too much lack of inner communication. I may decide to hold it back if I think it is desirable. And it may be desirable.

By now you should have the picture of Thornley printed backwards and my note asking for the simplest touching up to make it look most like Oswald.
