THE PRESIDENT'S COMMISSION ON  
THE ASSASSINATION OF PRESIDENT  
KENNEDY

The following information supplements that contained in memorandum dated August 2, 1966, at Dallas, Texas.

On August 11, 1966, Mr. Albert H. Newman, 310 East 75th Street, New York, New York, who identified himself as a correspondent for the "Reporter Magazine" and McGraw-Hill Book Company, both of New York, telephonically contacted a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation at Dallas, Texas.

Mr. Newman stated that with respect to the information he had furnished on July 27, 1966, he had made inquiries and had determined that Mrs. Thelma Lucio "is absolutely clean", and had no connection whatsoever with Lee Harvey Oswald or the assassination.

Mr. Newman also advised that he had checked into the death of Professor William Thomas Wolf, previously mentioned by Mr. Newman, and that he had determined that this death was definitely accidental, and therefore neither Lee Harvey Oswald nor George De Mohrenschildt, had any connection with such death.

Mr. Newman commented that he merely wanted to furnish the foregoing information to the Federal Bureau of Investigation which might preclude any necessity for the Federal Bureau of Investigation conducting additional investigation.
