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CAN'T LOSE

If Richard Nixon becomes the next U.S. President, what will that mean to his law firm of Nixon, Mudge, Rose, Guthrie, Alexander & Mitchell?

Attorneys estimate that it will increase the law firm's annual gross by at least \$20 million.

The last lawyer to be elected U.S. President was Franklin D. Roosevelt. After his election in 1932, Roosevelt continued to be listed as a senior partner of the New York firm of Roosevelt & O'Connor.

Whether Nixon will follow the Roosevelt practice or temporarily remove his name has not as yet been decided. Certainly Richard Nixon has been good for the company and vice versa.

When Nixon joined Mudge, Rose, etc. in 1963, he was earning less than \$100,000 a year, and the firm's business was conducted by about 55 attorneys. After Nixon joined, he earned \$200,000 and up each year and brought in so much business that the company hired another 60 attorneys.

Some of the major corporations availing themselves of Nixon, Mudge, Rose, etc. legal services are Swersharp-Schick, Studebaker-Worthington, General Cigar, Pepsi-Cola, Mutual Insurance of New York, Mitsui of Japan, and other large companies.

The law firm has not only helped Nixon financially but also politically. John Mitchell, Nixon's campaign manager, is also his law partner. Leonard Garment, another Nixon political braintrust, is another law partner, as is Thomas Evans, head of

the United Citizens for Nixon. Whether Nixon wins or loses, his law firm stands to gain.

RUMANIA

Before World War II Rumania was one of the most virulent anti-Semitic countries in Europe, with a population of one million Jews. Having turned over most of its Jewish population to the Nazis during the war and sold others for ransom, Rumania is now down to 100,000 Jews. They are remarkably well treated considering Rumania's history.

Rumania is currently the only Communist nation which has diplomatic relations with Israel. There are 18 synagogues in Bucharest, and the Chief Rabbi is a member of the Rumanian Parliament. Despite strong Soviet pressure, Rumania refused to condemn Israel last year when Moshe Dayan and his men crushed the Arabs in the 6-day war.

Rich in natural resources such as oil, minerals, and natural gas, Rumania may well be on a collision course with Russia. For more than two decades now the Russians have used Rumania as a granary. Today, Rumania would like to sell more of her oil to West Germany in exchange for modern machinery with which to speed industrialization of the nation.

Rumanian Marxists are politically rigid. There has been no liberalization in Rumania. But the ruling Russians in the Kremlin are now regarded as irrational, and after the Soviet invasion of Czechoslovakia, Rumania is fearful of a Soviet invasion on any pretext.

PRESTIS AND DISSENT

Pope Paul and his bishops may discipline dissenting subordinates who disagree with the Vatican's birth control policy, but the little people in many Catholic areas of the world, especially in Latin America, side with the local parish priest who favors the pill.

Take the state of Maranhao which few U.S. citizens have ever heard about. Maranhao is situated in northeastern Brazil. The state has a population of about 5 million. The

average life span in Maranhao is 29.6. More than 70% of these Brazilians are illiterate. At least half are unemployed. Out of every 1000 Maranhao children born, about 300 die soon after of gastro-enteritis, inflammation of the intestines. At least 20% of the population suffer from malaria, and 80% are infected with worms. The ill health, destitution and hopelessness of these people is beyond belief, and yet the "fagelados" (the beaten ones), as they are called, multiply like flies.

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
