United Press International A spokesman for Presidentelect Nixon said yesterday views on the Middle East expressed by former Pennsylvania Gov. William Scranton "are Mr. Scranton's, not Mr. Nixon's."

 Scranton visited the Middle
East on a 10-day fact-finding trip for Nixon and commented in Jerusalem that the new Republican Administration would pursue a more "even handed" Mideast policy.

The remark reportedly s upset Israeli officials, who e feared it might signal a U.S. policy switch bringing the . United States closer to the Arabs in the continuing Arab-Israeli dispute.

"Mr. Nixon has not talked to Gov. Scranton since he left," Nixon's press secretary, Ronald Ziegler, said yesterday. "His mission was a fact-finding one, and he has not reo ported back to Mr. Nixon.

r "So any views Mr. Scranton expresses as he is going along r are Mr. Scranton's, not Mr. Nixon's."

Asked about a Rome report that quoted Scranton as saying the Nixon administration would offer a new Mideast peace plan, Ziegler said this was an error made in translaof tion. He announced that Scranton would report to re Nixon on his trip in New York today.
