AID FOR RADICALS DISPUTED BY C.I.A.

69-70 Studies, Rejected by White House, Found No Tie to Foreign Governments

Special to The New York Times WASHINGTON, May 24-The Central Intelligence Agency reported in 1969 and 1970 that it could find no substantial evidence to support the Nixon Administration's view that foreign governments were supplying undercover agents and funds to radicals and Black Panther groups in the United States, White House and intelligence ources said today.

The C.I.A.'s findings were rejected, the sources said, by igh-level White House aides who arranged in late 1970 for 5 agents from the Federal Bureau of Investigation to open overseas intelligence posts n 20 countries. The bureau's expansion is said to have ngered Richard Helms, then he C.I.A. director, and other gency officials.

"We tried to show that the radical movements were homegrown, indigenous responses to perceived grievances and problems that had been growing for years," one official who worked on the agency's analyses recalled. "We said the radicals were clean and that we couldn't find anything. But all it turned out to be was nother nail in Helms's coffin."
