Quoting unnamed sources, the magazine said that "in recent weeks, IRS special intelligence agents who do only criminal investigations have interviewed Edward L. Morgan, a onetime White House aide; Arthur Blech, Mr. Nixon's personal accountant, and Frank DeMarco, the President's former tax lawyer.

"The key question," Newsweek said, "is whether a fraud-, ulent deed to Mr. Nixon's vice presidential papers was drawn up in the spring of 1970 to make it appear that he had actually given the papers to the archives one year earlierbefore congressional legislation outlawed deductions for such gifts."

The magazine said IRS spokesmen have refused to comment on th inquiry, and the White House says it has not been notified of a crim as investigaton of the President.
