Coverage of Watergate SAIGON, South Vietnam, Aug. 2 (AP)—The American Radio Service Vietnam has discontinued verbatim cover-age of the Watergate hear-ings because listeners wanted ings because listeners wanted to hear more music, a spokesman for the United States defense attaché's office said

verbatim coverage of the hearings was cut off after the first day of testimony by H. R. Haldeman, former Presidential aide, this week. The station says it serves more than 5,000 Americans in Indochina.

The office, which runs the station, said that there had been no connection between Mr. Haldeman's testifying and the station's decision.

"There were many com-plaints from the audience, which felt it was not inter-ested in hearing the verbatim testimony," the spokesman said. "They wanted to hear more music," he added, ac-knowledging that some com-plaints have been received plaints have been received about the cancelation.
