Nixon Says Pat Saved His Life

New York

In a magazine interview, former President Nixon gives his wife, Pat, credit for saving his life when he was desperately ill last October.

In the interview published by McCalls' magazine in its May issue, Mr. Nixon said "when I came out of shock, and I'm told I was more dead than alive. Pat was there..."

Mr. Nixon was hospital-

ized in Long Beach last October 23 for treatment of phiebitis. A blood glot was discovered in his left leg and he underwent urgent surgery October 29.

He went into shock fellowing the operation and was on the critical list at Memorial Respital Medical Center for six days. His doctor, John Lungren, said at the time he had been near death,

"In the weeks after that, if It liadn't been for her, I think it's her immense capacity to comfort and encourage that railed mathrough," Mr. Nixon said.

"I doubt if I would have made it without her. Her love, her strength, her constant reassurance, her faith in me as a human being and a husband led the out of the depths."

Pai Nixon was quoted as saying, "Except for the grace of God and the doctors he would have died."

The former first lady soded, "I leve my husband, I believe in him and I think he has been a great president, Nothing has changed that

"Like everyone else, he

has probably made mistakes
— no one is infallible. But he
thas done many good things
for our country and the
world."

Summing up for the magaline, Mr. Nixon said, "The best decision I ever made was choosing Pat to be my wife, my partner in life. I've had prestige, power and even, at times, some money. Those things come and go as they have with me.

"But Pat has stood by my side during good and bad times alike, What more could any man ask?"

Reporter Trude B. Feldman, who visited Mr. Nixon's home, said Mrs. Nixon handles the special
