Parade 1415/74 One of ex-President Nixon's special assistants, earning \$36,000 a year, was convicted of shoplifting two shirts. A security director shoplifted \$26 worth of cosmetics for a girlfriend, then was fired from his \$30,000 a year job. A housewife was convicted of shoplifting a \$10 scarf. The list of these incidents is seemingly endless. They are discussed in a shoplifting study financed by the Metropolitan Board of Trade in Washington, D.C. The study shows that between August, 1973, and July, 1974, merchants in the nation's capital lost an estimated \$345 million to shoplifters, an increase of 46 percent over the previous year. The study revealed that 55 percent of the thievery is the work of middleincome peopler 20 percent is the handiwork of upperincome people, and the primary offenders are. teen-agers (45 percent) and housewives (25 percent).
