Korff Fund For Nixon Is in Debt

Rabbi Baruch Korff says his fund to pay former President Nixon's legal fees is \$99,428 in the red with more bills ex-

pected.

A source close to Mr. Nixon in San Clemente said that in the face of mounting hospital and legal costs, Korff's President Nixon Justice Fund will provide "essential assistance" for Mr. Nixon to pay his bills.
