Fresident Nixon signed a bill providing \$4.4 billion for activities of the Departments of State, Justice, Commerce and several other government agencies.

The President announced he will nominate James W. Plummer, 53, a vice president of the Lockheed Aircraft Corp. in California to be under secretary of the air force. He will succeed John L. McLucas, who was elevated to the post of Secretary of the Air Force in July.
