SST GOES ON Although the Anglo-French supersonic airliner, the Concorde, is virtually unsaleable--too noisy, too expensive, too uneconomical--and Congress decided in March, 1971, to terminate the U.S. supersonic transport development program, NASA is still spending \$11.7 million on SST research.

President Nixon justi-

fies this in his 1974 budget in order "to provide the United States with the option to initiate development of an advanced supersonic transport later in the 1970's."
