The chairman of the House Government Operations Com-mittee and the committee's ranking Republican member jointly blasted the White House for joining with business lobbyists in a last-ditch effort to sabotage a bill establishing a Consumer Protection Agency.

Chet Holifield (D-Rep. Calif.), chairman of the committee which is schedule to begin final drafting of the bill Tuesday, and Rep. Frank Hor ton (R-N.Y.) charged the White House with "knuckling under" to pressure from business by recommending amendments which would dilute the power of the proposed agency.
