

NYT - July 21, 1963 - R.M. Nixon, interviewed in Vienna, opposes linking the test ban to any condition implying division of the world between U.S. & USSR.

NYT - July 26, 1963 - Nixon news Conf in W. Berlin - warns ~~that~~ against nonaggression pact as price for the test ban.

NYT - July 27, 1963 - Nixon, in Frankfurt (W. Germany), doubts salutary political effects of test ban.

NYT - July 29, 1963 - Nixon, in Paris, sees overwhelming Sen. ratification of test ban but urges close Republican scrutiny; personally backs it; proposes codicil stating E. Germany's adherence would not affect US nonrecognition of E. Germany.

NYT - Aug. 2, 1963 - Nixon, in Paris TV int., says US should share nuclear data with France if it would induce her to sign ban.

NYT - Sept 24, 1963 - Nixon, in N.Y., calls treaty the beginning of a dangerous period in the Cold War, but urges ratification.

NYT - Oct 9, 1963 - In TV interview, Nixon says he opposes selling 184,000,000 of wheat to USSR as ~~too~~ detrimental to the cause of freedom.

NYT Oct 25, 1963 - Paris: Nixon holds US "must live with" a Gov't in S. Vietnam even if it finds it unsatisfactory

NYT - Nov 7, 1963 - (pp. 1, 2, 3) - Nixon reportedly phoned Mrs. Ngo ~~Dinh~~ Dinh Nhu about US consulate refusal to grant asylum to Ngo Dinh Cao.
