Nixon Horror Is Censored

Rep. Richard D. McCarthy (D-N.Y.) wants to know who censors President Nixon's speeches — after he delivers them.

McCarthy said in a speech last night in Boston that on July 3 Mr. Nixon, referring to presidential abhorrence to chemical biological warfare, said, "The specter of chemical and biological warfare arouses horror and revulsion throughout the world."

On July 16, when McCarthy obtained a copy of the speech from the White House, the presidential quote was inked out. "I have heard that the strong objections of a member of the Armed Services in Secretary Laird's office led to the change," McCarthy said.

"I wonder if President Nixon approved the change of his original message?" the New Yorker asked.
