Links Oswald With U.S. CIA

VANCOUVER (CP)—A link between Lee Harvey Oswald, Clay Shaw, David Ferrie and the U.S. Central Intelligence Agency is claimed by an American now in Vancouver.

Donald P. Norton, 35, told The Sun in an interview here he encountered all three while he was on the payroll of the CIA, the U.S. espionage agency.

"Norton first came to see The Sun July 8," says the newspaper. "Since then many details of Norton's story have been confirmed. But the authenticity of his central claims defy verification by normal newspaper investigation."

Lee Harvey Oswald was named by the Warren Commission as the lone assassin of President Kennedy in November, 1963. Clay Shaw, a New Orleans businessman, has been indicted by a grand jury on charges of conspiring to kill the president following an investigation by District Attorney Jim Garrison of New Orleans.

David Ferrie, who died in February this year, was a central figure in Garrison's investigation. Mr. Garrison claims the assassination resulted from a complex conspiracy involving para-military groups linked with the CIA and dissident Cuban exiles.
