Dear Jim,

I've been thinking more about Nosenko and the Hart testimony about him and the HSCA's covering up.

I think that I recall a statement by Nosenko having to do with how he was treated by the CIA, perhaps prepared for or in a deposition to HSCA.

Do you know what this can be? If you do and have it I'd appreciate a copy

I noticed that Hart testified that Nosenko was, implication at the beginning, kept in a safe house in suburban Washington. Hart also testified that Nosenko was moved to a place he did not identify but we know is Camp Pearry, Va. No other places in Hart's testimony.

I believe that Nosenko said he was kept first in Northwest Washington and gave a lucid description of his treatment there and of his subsequent abuse. I am clear on what Nosenko said about his reading of printing with toothpaste, his effort to keep a calendar, his food and lack of it, and none of this is in the published HSCA staff report.

And I am confident that he was not blindfolded when he was removed from and taken to the safe house(s). So, he could have described it/them.

I'm trying to fill in what I regard as a meaningful gap.

Hope you did well before Ritchie yesterday.
