

ADEQUATE BLOOD banking facilities and better methods of preserving platelets will be necessary to any extension of such treatment he emphasized, noting that the Philadelphia group uses more than 10,000 pints of fresh blood a year in preparing platelet concentrates.

Both reports, commented Dr. Wendell - Stanley, - panel chairman and Nobel Prize winning virologist from the University of California "offer more hope for children with leukemia."
