

## Warrant Out for Novel in JFK Plot

NEW ORLEANS, March 31 (AP)—District Attorney Jim Garrison obtained warrants today for the arrest of Gordon Novel and a Cuban exile leader on charges of conspiring to burglarize a munitions bunker in 1961. Novel is a missing witness in the Kennedy assassination probe.

Garrison charged Novel, 29, a former French quarter bar owner, and Sergio Arcacha Smith of Dallas with conspiring with David W. Ferrie to commit simple burglary of a munitions dump at Houma, La., a town about 40 miles southwest of New Orleans.

Garrison has alleged that Ferrie, Clay L. Shaw and Lee Harvey Oswald plotted in mid-September 1963 to kill President John F. Kennedy. Ferrie and Oswald are dead. Shaw, a retired New Orleans business executive, has been indicted on a charge of conspiring to kill the President.

The arrest warrants were sent to Montreal, Canada, where Novel is reported to be hiding, and to Dallas.

### Hospital Releases 1960 JFK 'Plotter'

CONCORD, N.H., March 31

(UPI)—A man once accused of plotting the bombing death of President John F. Kennedy was granted his unconditional release Thursday from the New Hampshire Hospital.

Richard Paul Pavlick, now an 80-year-old resident of Ashland, Mass., on Dec. 13, 1966 had been placed on a three-month parole from the mental hospital.

Pavlick was arrested in December, 1960, in Palm Beach, Fla., for allegedly planning to kill the President by making himself a human bomb.
