However, this technicality is merely necessary to place Novel here during that month, Alcock said. "That person has nothing to do with the facts of the crime," he said of the affidavit

Extradition papers on Arcacha Smith, former anti-Castro leader in New Orleans, are also being prepared, and will be ready by Monday or Tuesday, Alcock said.

Arcacha Smith, 44, was arrested in Dallas on the same burglary-conspiracy charge and is also free on bond.

Alcock said great care must be exercised in preparing such papers. "If you make a mis-take, you're out of court," he
