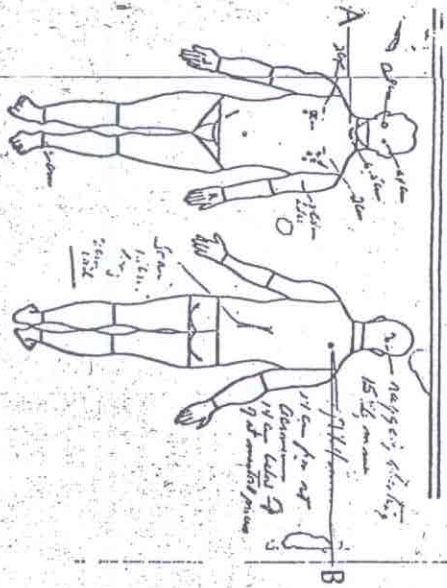
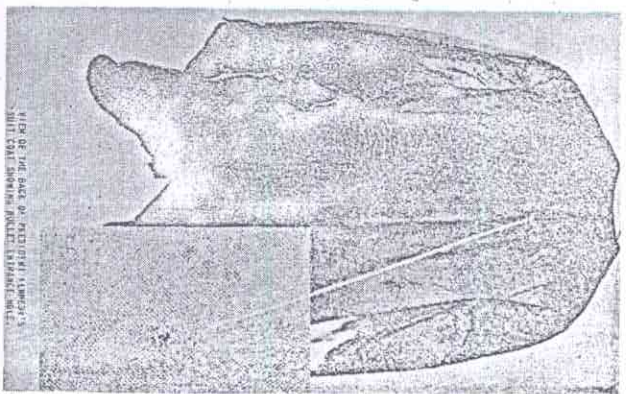


**NEW RESEARCH**—Three exhibits taken from the Warren Commission report illustrate what author Edward Jay Epstein regards as confusion as to the first shot which hit President Kennedy. At left is a drawing prepared at the direction of the autopsy physicians demonstrating their



conclusion that the shot in question entered the President's body at the base of the neck and emerged from the throat. In the center are two working drawings used by the doctors in the autopsy room. Here the doctor placed a dot (marked "8") to show where the bullet entered. It is



several inches below the collar line and seemingly too low to permit bullet exit (from point "X") if, as assumed, the bullet had come from above. At right is a view of the back of the coat President Kennedy was wearing again the entry hole of the bullet is significantly below the collar.
