Anti-New Deal Paper Assured, O'Daniel Says

Senator O'Daniel (D., Tex.), antifourth termer and tter foe of most Roosevelt Policies, declared yesterday the first issue of his revived political newspaper. The W. Lee O'Daniel News out Tuesday, had a pictural of 100,000 reaching 45 States.

The four-page weekly is printed in Fort Worth, Tex., but its publication office is here. Sufficient newsprint for a year was purchased recently and stored in a warehouse at Fort Worth, O'Daniel said.

"I'm not worrying about newsprint," he observed, "unless some Federal agency tries to pull a shenanigan."

"All that news print is under guard day and night there in the warehouse," he added. "There are some folks who would just as soon we didn't print the W. Lee O'Daniel News."

In Tuesday's special July 4 edition, O'Daniel rapped the Roosevelt administration as a "dynasty" that was being perpetuated by Federal bureaus. The paper carried facsimiles of the Constitution, the Bill of Rights and the Declaration of Independence.

Originated in April, 1940, when O'Daniel was Governor of Texas, the paper suspended publication about the time he came to the Senate in 1941. His wife will now serve as managing editor of the paper.

Senator Green (D., R. I.), chairman of the Senate Privileges and Election Committee, recently said he planned to question O'Daniel about contributions and subscriptions received in connection with the newspaper. The Senator said he would be glad to testify before the committee, if called.
