In part at least this is because the capy of the rough draft I had and sent you was not the original, which was not returned by the man who offered to retype it.

Any punctuation, a period if the end of the sentence, is after (page 100).

When What is quoted and indented, single space, is a quotation of a book or document, the need for " is eliminated. The indentation and single-spacing take care of that. If what is quoted from a source is within quotes in what is quoted, those quotes and kept in.

You've made very few typos. Wish I could type that well!
