I hope this note finds you an Lil healthier than your last short note indicated. I have reread your manuscript on Hersh to develop a better bibliography than I had earlier delivered. While I have been unable to locate some references by page for some of the Toronto and Boston newspapers, I have been able to piece together my best guess for the rest of the citations you have used in your manuscript. Please look at the enclosure (kept as a separate document from the earlier bibliography) and add, delete, edit or dispose as you see fit. I hope the last manuscript on the Menninger book arrived with the eight diskettes in good condition and that the package that followed shortly after that also arrived (two boxes: one an original manuscript and the manuscript with incorporated changes)

How is your latest Posner trash review coming? I scanned it at the local Barnes and Noble Bookstore and found that you will likely have plenty of fodder for another book. Right now I am plowing through the Twyman book: *Bloody Treason*. I am appalled that Twyman thinks that the assassination of JFK can be attributed to a single cabal that controlled the events start to finish rather than a series of independent conspiracies that interlock to create the appearance of a single grand conspiracy. I can conceive of a Dallas-based conspiracy of Dallas police elements working with underworld elements and individuals with anti-Castro Cuban ties to the CIA based on a loose knowledge of the core "facts" of the assassination. This clumsy conspiracy could then be enwrapped by a larger federal Executive Branch government assets (CIA, FBI, Secret Service, and miscellaneous elements: military, postal service, etc.) to protect themselves from embarrassing disclosures. Finally, the last conspiracy would be that of politicians in the government and influential figures outside the government using their positions to unsuccessfully maintain a lid on the whole event and subsequent investigations. Not pretty and certainly not a legacy I would want my generation to pass on to the next.
